

Evan Rachel Wood (Anne) A Raleigh native, Evan Rachel Wood got her start at Theatre in the Park. She gained critical acclaim for her role on *Westworld* and was nominated for an Emmy in both 2018 and 2017 for "Lead Actress in a Drama Series," a Critics Choice Award for "Best Actress in a Drama Series," a Golden Globe Nomination for "Best Performance by an

Actress in a TV Series, Drama", and a SAG Nomination for "Outstanding Performance by an Ensemble in a Drama Series." She has also received a Golden Globe and Emmy nomination for "Outstanding Supporting Actress in a Miniseries or Movie" for her portrayal of Veda Pierce in the HBO miniseries *Mildred Pierce*. Wood had her breakout role in 2003 with Catherine Hardwicke's controversial independent film, Thirteen (2003), for which she was nominated for a Golden Globe as Best Actress in a Drama as well as a Best Actress SAG Award. She can also be seen in notable films such as *Kajillionaire*, The Ides of March, The Wrestler, and Practical Magic. She will also be portraying Madonna in the upcoming Weird Al biopic Weird for Roku tv. Also an accomplished singer, you can hear her vocal talents in the Disney animated film, Frozen 2 as Queen Iduna and the movie musical based on music by The Beatles, Across the Universe. She is now one half of the Cabaret band 'Evan and Zane.' When she is not acting, she is a fierce advocate for victims of Domestic Violence and has helped numerous bills get passed to protect survivors.



Megan Montgomery (Laura) was most recently seen as Alicia in Small Mouth Sounds with Honest Pint Theatre. Other roles/productions include: Siobhan, Curious Incident of the Dog in the Nighttime (Actors Theatre Charlotte), Pandarus, Troilus and Cressida (Shakespeare Globe Residency), Kate, Henry IV (Glasgow's Bard and the Botanics) Everyman, Everyman (Colorado

Springs' Theatreworks), and several productions with Theatre in the Park to include *A Christmas Carol* and *HAIR*. Megan has an MA in Classical and Contemporary Text (Acting) from the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland, and a BA in Theatre and Dance from UT Austin. She has recently continued her training in animal work under Gabrielle Moleta with Kalamata Drama in Greece. Chris Hinton (*Pierre*) is a Raleigh native and an alumni of Appalachian State University. Chris was last seen in Honest Pint's production of *Small Mouth Sounds* and has performed with various companies throughout the triangle of the last 9 years including: *Everscape*, *Macbeth*, and *The Coarse Acting Show*. He is extremely excited to be back on stage at Theatre in the Park!



Gus Allen (*Man*) grew up in Minnesota before venturing to North Carolina in 2007. Besides acting, Gus enjoys board games, script writing and praying for the day when the Minnesota Vikings finally return to the Super Bowl. Gus' favorite roles include George Bailey (*It's a Wonderful Life*), Father Flynn (*Doubt*), Mr. Tumnus (*The Lion, the Witch & the Wardrobe*)

and Algernon (*The Importance of Being Earnest*.) Thanks to God for continuing to put all the broken pieces back together.



When Memorial Auditorium sat largely unused and undervalued, David produced the first series of theatrical productions on its stage, beginning a process of rediscovery and expansion which eventually resulted in the renovation and expansion that has resulted in the current Progress Energy Center for the Performing Arts. In honor of his many achievements, Raleigh's City Council voted unanimously to rename the theatre's facility "The Ira David Wood III Pullen Park Theatre." In September of 2010, he was inducted into the Raleigh Hall of Fame.

He wrote and directed the Opening Ceremonies for the Summer Olympic Festival - the largest single event ever held in North Carolina. He directed the premiere production of the outdoor drama *First For Freedom* in Halifax, NC. His original production, *A Capitol Idea*, was the highlight of Raleigh's Bicentennial celebration. Four of his original productions have aired on WRAL-TV. Two of his original plays (*Eros & Illinois* and *Requiem For a King*) have had extended runs Off-Broadway. His script, *Requiem For a King*, was optioned by Motown Productions. During the summer, David serves as Artistic Director of The Lost Colony outdoor drama on Roanoke Island, NC.

For North Carolina Theatre, David's starring roles include *Man Of La Mancha* (Don Quixote - in three productions), *Funny Girl* (Flo Ziegfeld), *Peter Pan* (Captain Hook), *La Cage aux Folles* (Georges), *Oliver* (Fagin), *The Wizard of Oz* (Wicked Witch of the West), *The Full Monty* (Harold), *Grease* (Mrs. Lynch), and *The Sound Of Music* (Captain Von Trapp).

Consistently voted Best Local Actor in decades of public opinion polls, David has managed to accumulate impressive film and television credits, having appeared on screen with such stars as Christopher Walken, Natalie Wood, Neil Patrick Harris, Cliff Robertson, Matthew Modine, James Earl Jones, Burt Reynolds, and Louise Fletcher.

Though his list of acclaimed theatre roles is unrivaled in our area, David is probably best known and loved for annually portraying the miserly Ebenezer Scrooge in his own musical adaptation of *A Christmas Carol*, which celebrated its 48th year of consecutive

production this past December. With three international tours to its credit, and having played to over one million people, the production is now cited as "... one of the most successful shows in North Carolina theater history."


